- 1953 Tournament established, held at Desert Inn Country Club, Las Vegas, Nevada

- 1967 Moved to Stardust Country Club, Las Vegas
- 1969 Relocated to La Costa Resort and Spa, Carlsbad, California
- 1986 Dates changed from May to January
- 1999 Relocated to Maui
- 2017 Sentry signed a five-year deal with the PGA Tour to become the tournament's title sponsor beginning in 2018
- 2018 Dustin Johnson wins Sentry Tournament of Champions
- 2019 Xander Schauffele wins Sentry Tournament of Champions

COMMUNITY IMPACT

Since its move to Maui in 1999, the tournament's hosts have donated more than \$6.6 million to community charities.
